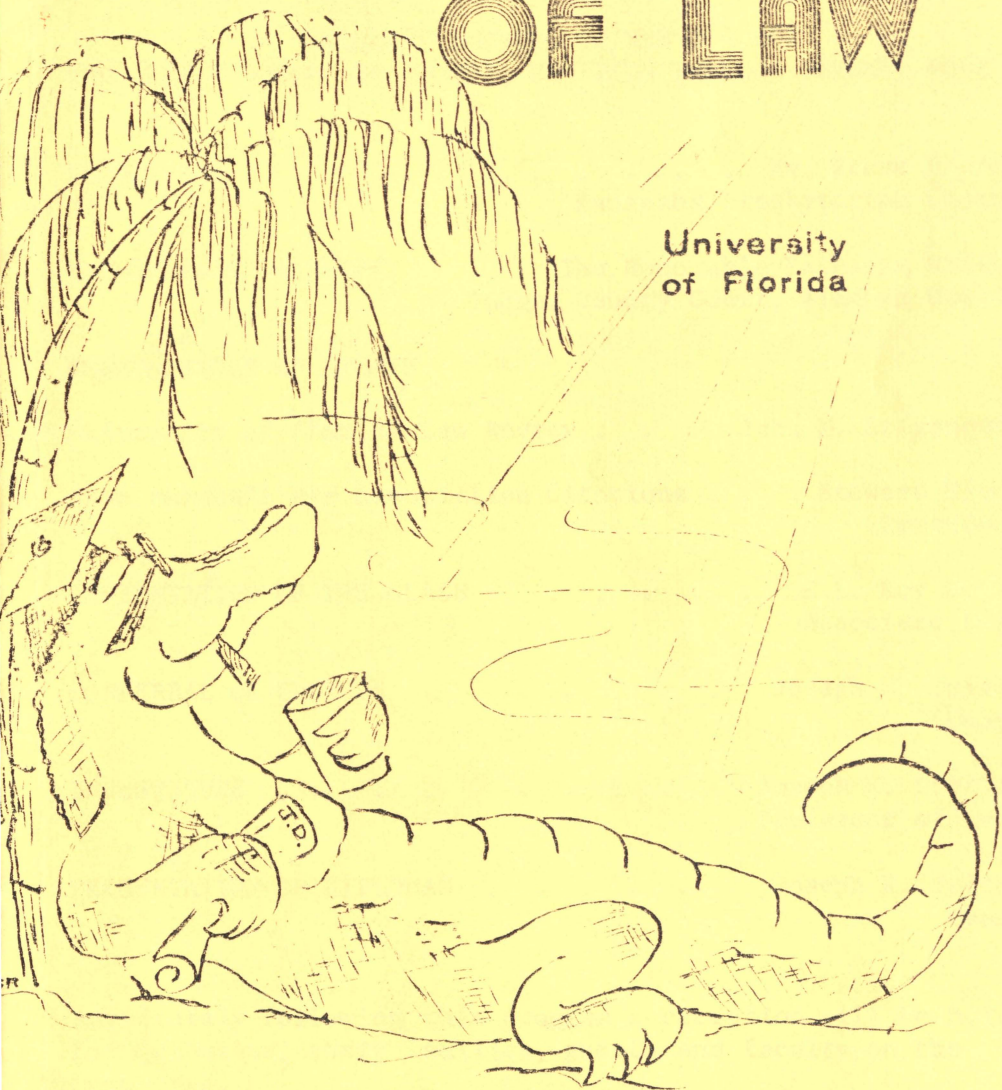

JUDGE, COUNTY COURT, ALACHUA COUNTY

Judge Wright, born in Bedford, Pennsylvania, completed her undergraduate work at Carnegie Institute. She received her Juris Doctor at the Spessard L. Holland Law Center in December 1967 and entered into the private practice of law in June 1968. While engaged in private practice, she served as a part-time instructor at the Holland Law Center. In December 1973, Judge Wright gave up her practice to serve as the full time Assistant Public Defender. Governor Rubin Askew appointed Judge Wright to the Bench in 1974, where she now serves as Chief Administrative Judge of the Criminal Division of Alachua County Court. Since her appointment she has developed a community service sentencing option program for minor misdemeanor offenders and has reorganized and expanded the release on recognizance bond program.

She has also served on the Board of Directors of the Alachua County Chapter of A.C.L.U., The Board of Directors of the Alachua County Storefront Legal Aid Association, the League of Women Voters State Committee on the study of Criminal Justice System, and is a member of the Governor's Region Three Drug Abuse Advisory Council.

In her spare time, Judge Wright enjoys watching her favorite football team, the Pittsburg Stealers and riding a motorbike around the rural areas of Alachua County.
